## BUT... NOT ENTIRELY NEW

The Book of Exodus
Includes Numerous
Connections to Genesis

### "THESE ARE THE NAMES"

Exodus is careful to connect its story to the story of Genesis--not *just* in historical sequence, but theological fulfillment.


#### "BE FRUITFUL AND MULTIPLY"

Exodus connects itself to the beginning of Genesis, seeing that God's creation continues to advance in numerous ways (cf. Exd 12–15).

#### "PLACED HIM IN AN ARK"


Exodus connects itself to God's salvation history, showing how he is the one in control of his people's future (cf. Gen 6–9).


#### **AUTHORSHIP**

God works through the Holy Spirit, using Moses (e.g., Exd 17.14; 24.4). But inspiration goes *beyond* mere authorship.



### **AUDIENCE**

Adapts and changes as the God's people moves through history, each stage finding different aspects of the Truth.



#### INTENT

To reclaim God's children and transform them into God's people so that he might have communion with them.



#### REDEMPTION

"I will bring you out... I will redeem you..."

### PEOPLEHOOD

"I will take you as my people, and I will be your God"

## **TRANSFORMATION**

"You will know that I am the LORD your God"

## PROMISE

"I will give you the land that I swore to give to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob..."

Crisis: Israel has the Wrong Master (Egypt)

**God Hears their Plea** 

God Saves Israel from Egypt

God Plans to Dwell with Israel

Crisis: Israel Chooses the Wrong Master (Calf)

**God Hears Moses' Plea** 

God Preserves Israel from Death

God Plans to Dwell with Israel
