# The Word ("Logos")

- Words enable one person to tell another what is in their mind
- Logos Something said or unsaid which embodies a concept or idea
- Jesus is The Word
  - > John 1:14 "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us
  - > Rev. 19:11-13 "His name is called The Word of God."
- > The Word is the expression of God's Mind
  - Hebrews 1:1-3
- > Through The Word we know God
  - > John 8:19 "if you knew Me, you would know My Father also."
  - > John 14: "He who has seen Me has seen the Father."

#### Jesus is God


- In the beginning...the Word was with God (literally "face to face")
- The Word was God (Deity)
  - Jesus is not the Father, but is Deity (God)
  - Gnosticism beginning to take root (Jesus was not God)

# All Things created through Him

➤ Col 1:16-17 "By Him all things were created...All things were created through Him and for Him."

#### Jesus is the Life

- > Spiritual/Eternal Life
  - Used 47 times in the Gospel (in almost every chapter).
  - > Jesus is not just the creator of life, but the SOURCE of eternal life

# Jesus is the Light

- Used 16 times in Chapters 1-12
- > The darkness is where ignorance, stumbling, and sin exist
- Jesus is the SOURCE of Light

The Choice (John 8:12) – "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."



# Testimony of John the Baptist "Who Are You?"

- "Why are you baptizing?"

#### "Who Are You?"

- What are the Jews trying to figure out?
- Did the Jews understand that the Messiah was coming?
- > Elijah?
  - ➤ Malachi 4:5-6 Last verses in the OT, prior to 400-year silence
  - What would the Jews have been expecting based on Malachi?
- > The Prophet?
  - Deuteronomy 18:15
  - Who was the Prophet? How do we know?
  - ➤ How was the Prophet like Moses?

Then who are you?

➤ Isaiah 40:3-5 — the preparation for the coming of the Christ

Compare Luke 3:4-6 "All flesh will see the salvation of God"

How is John preparing the nation of Israel?

What was the purpose of John's baptism?

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# "Why are you baptizing?"

- By what authority was John baptizing?
- Consider what the Jews were seeing
  - > They were familiar with water and purification from the Old Law
  - > This was something new
  - ➤ If you aren't the Christ, or Elijah, or the Prophet, by what authority are you, a mere man, baptizing people?
- > John's answer
  - What I am doing is insignificant by comparison
  - > There is someone else among us who is so much greater

### The Lamb of God

- ➤ John had already baptized Jesus. Jesus was coming back from the 40 days in the wilderness
- Lamb of God, a familiar concept
  - > Lamb killed every year to mark the Passover
  - > Two lambs sacrificed every day (Exodus 29:30)
  - > Isaiah 53:7 reference to the Messiah
  - > How is John's "introduction" of Jesus significant?
  - What concept should they have understood from this?
- "He existed before Me"

# John Explains His Baptism

- "I did not recognize Him"
- "So that He might be manifested to Israel"
- John's baptism was for what purpose?
  - > As a method of repentance for the Israelites
  - > To identify to John that Jesus was the Son of God
- > Why is this so significant?
