THE POINT

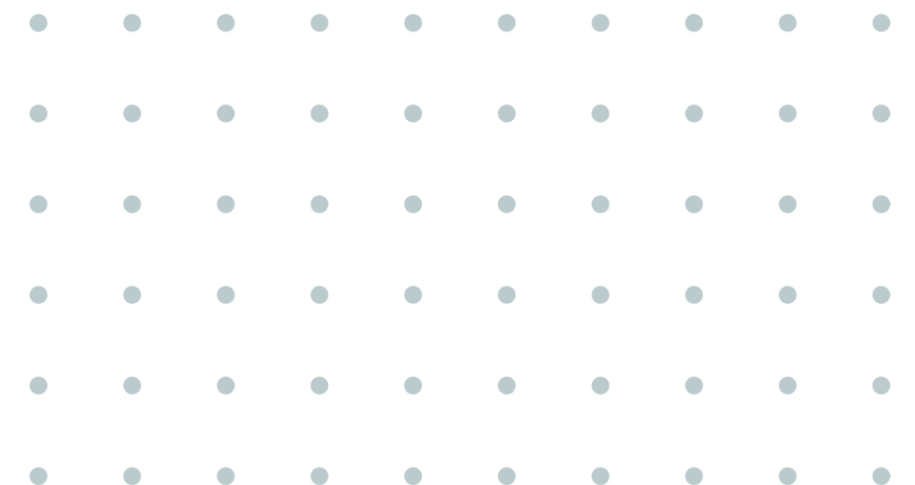
Not just a lesson of humility,
