
## The Sign (v1-15)

- The Pool of Bethesda
- Man afflicted for 38 years
  - Deuteronomy 2:14-15
- "Do you wish to get well?"
- What is the sign pointing to?
  - Backdrop of wilderness wandering (this feast & Ch. 6)
  - Water that cannot heal (Ch. 4)
  - Helpless and hopeless for 38 years (because of sin)
  - Jesus is superior to Moses



### The Conflict (v.10-18)


- The Problem with the Sabbath
  - Carrying things (Jer.17:22)
  - ➤ Going "out of your place"/traveling (Ex.16:29-30)
  - ➤ Healing on the Sabbath?
- What laws were Jesus and the man breaking?
  - Talmud created a "fence around the Torah"
  - What was considered "out of your place?"



## Jesus' Response (v17-47)


- I am equal with God
  - > 17-20: In Works (I do what God does)
  - > 21: In Power (I give life to whom I choose)
  - 22: In Judgment
  - 23: In Honor that is deserved
- Jesus' calling (Verse 24)
  - He who hears My words and believes (honor)
  - > Has life
  - Does not come into judgment






## Jesus' Response (v17-47)


- First Resurrection (25-27)
  - Who are the dead He is referring to?
  - Consider the following
    - The tense of verse 24 ("has passed")
    - "The hour is...now here"
    - Romans 6:13; Eph. 2:1-5; Eph. 5:14; Col. 2:13
    - Ezekiel 37 The image is clear: they were dead
- Second Resurrection (28-29)
  - Dead will be raised followed by judgment



## Jesus' Response (v17-47)

- Witnesses to Jesus' Deity
  - "If I alone testify, my testimony is not true."
  - > John the Baptist (32-35)
  - > His works (36)
  - > The Father (37-38) they had not heard His voice
  - The Scriptures (39-44)
    - They thought they had eternal life in the OT, but what did the Scriptures teach?
    - They would accept others without testimony

#### The Context

- Jesus does what God has already done (5:19)
  - Creation/Light and Life Chapter 1
  - Raised up like the serpent (Chapter 3)
  - Water (Chapter 4)
  - Bread/Food (Chapter 6)
- Exodus Symbolism
  - > The Passover was near (v4)
  - Moses crossing the sea and going up on the mountain
  - Where are we going to get food?
  - Don't forget Deuteronomy 18:15!



## The Sign

- But First, The Test
  - ➤ Mass of people (5,000 men + women/children)
  - What is the nature of this "test?"
  - Their response: We don't have enough!
  - > The right answer: We are insufficient, but You are not!
- > The Sign
  - Everyone is completely filled Jesus satisfies!
  - ➤ "Nothing may be lost" 12 baskets?
  - Life would be given
  - God's desire is that the entire nation would be saved!
